RULES FOR THE HORTICULTURE SECTION

This show will be judged in accordance with the rules of The Australian Horticultural Judges' Association Inc., as listed in that association's Publication 'The Australian Horticultural Show and Judges Manual'.

The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry and in that event of such refusal it is not required to give a reason or explanation.

1. All stems ends must be below the water level in a vase or container.
2. A container is a vessel of any size or shape.
3. Own foliage is permitted in an exhibit unless otherwise stated.
4. Cut flowers must not include flowering shrubs, berries or creepers but may include roses or hydrangeas.
5. Wiring of flowers is permitted in the Floral Art Section
6. All exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor, except in the Floral Art Section.
7. Exhibitors must supply their own containers.
8. C.V.A. means colour variation allowed.
9. Exhibitors must be strictly amateurs except Open Class Floral Art
10. Distinct means separate clones or varieties.
11. Novice is open to those who have not won a First Prize for that section at any Horticulture Show.
12. All pot plants must be in the possession of the exhibitor for no less than 3 months prior to the show.
13. To assist in the staging of exhibits the Committee advises that where possible **ALL EXHIBITS SHOULD BE NAMED.**
14. Exhibitors **MUST STATE THE SIZE OF ANY EXHIBIT IF IT EXCEEDS 40CM** in any direction when lodging entry.
